Listen to the Wind: The Story of Dr. Greg and the Three Cups of Tea

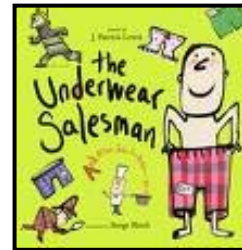
Greg Mortenson

The Invention of Hugo Cabret: A Novel in Words and Pictures

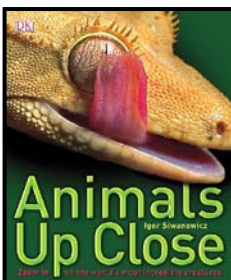
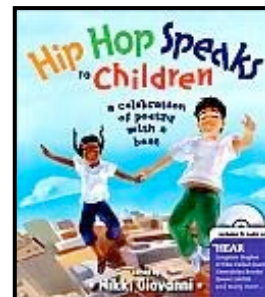

Animals Up Close: Zoom in on the World's Most Incredible Creatures

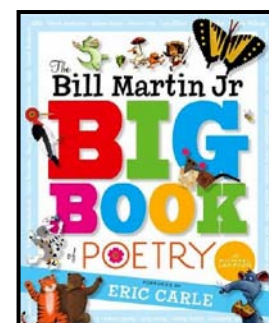

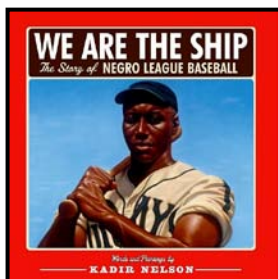
Up-close fantastic images of a variety of animals show the colors, textures, patterns, and structures found in nature. (96p. *Nonfiction*)

We Are the Ship: The Story of the Negro Baseball League

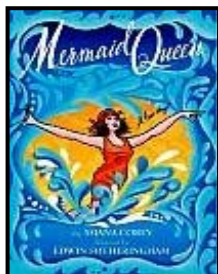
Kadir Nelson

Mermaid Queen: The Spectacular True Story of Annette Kellerman

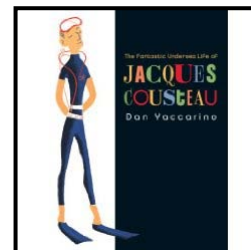
Shana Corey
